End of term arrangements

The College will close to students at 12 noon on Tuesday 19 December. Tutors have been asked to provide their learners with independent learning tasks.

Start of term arrangements

The College will reopen to students on Thursday 4 January at the usual time.

Attendance

You will be aware of our important focus on attendance. I know you also understand the really important link for your child between attendance, good progress and success in college. To put it simply, pupils with more than 90% attendance achieve, on average, a grade higher, than a similar student with less than 90% attendance. That can mean the difference in securing a place at University or an apprenticeship - or not. Looking ahead to next year, the college will continue to work in partnership with parents/carers to ensure attendance is as high as possible - we want the very best outcomes for each and every student at NewVIc.

UCAS and Progression

It is pleasing to see that over 800 students in Year 13 (equivalent to college Year 2) are making UCAS applications and others are searching and applying for apprenticeships for September 2024.

Over 50% of students have already sent off their UCAS application and are beginning to get interviews and or offers. Students are advised not to accept any offers yet and should wait to hear from all universities. Students will have time and receive information, advice and guidance when responding to offers in the new year.

Students yet to submit applications, are now in the critical stage as we reach the final UCAS deadline for equal consideration. Please continue to support them to complete their UCAS application, including personal statements and choices during the break. Students should check the Y13 Google Classroom for support resources. Students must complete their application and be ready to submit immediately upon their return.

Other students in term 1 have also been searching and applying for apprenticeships. They should continue to do this given the different recruitment windows by companies.

Exams: Have a Productive Break

Many students will be sitting either external examinations or mock exams for their A-Levels upon their return in January 2024. Students should have a relaxing and equally a productive break. They should continue to adopt a manageable timetable as discussed during one of their tutorials and keep their revision focussed, long term, active and transformative.
